CHIEF'S November 2016 REPORT TO THE BOARD

Presented December 19th, 2016

Calls for Service **DO NOT** include:

- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures

- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

During the month of November 2016, the Midland Police generated 633 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 667 incidents during the same time period in 2015. Incident reports generated to date for 2016 stand at 7941 as compared to 7358 for 2015.

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (15) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of November. Of the (15) thefts reported, (5) were cleared through investigation or charge, and (2) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate (46%)

There is a (21%) reduction in thefts over this time last year.

Mischief

There were (2) mischief's reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by investigation/charge and the balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate is (50%)

There is a (82%) reduction in mischief's over this time last year.

Break and Enter

A total of (3) break and enters were reported to the Service in November. (1) was cleared by investigation/charge. These matters are under investigation by the Service.

Clearance rate (33%)

There is a (75%) reduction in break and enters over this time last year.

Fraud

A total of (3) frauds were reported to the Service in November. (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion

Clearance rate (33%).

Assault

There were (3) assaults reported to the Service in the month of November. (1) was cleared through investigation or charge and (2) were cleared through discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate is (100%).

There is a (67%) reduction in common assault calls over this time last year

Assault Bodily Harm

There were two reports of assault causing bodily harm reported to the service this month. Both were cleared through investigation/charge.

Sexual Assault

There was (2) sexual assault reported this month. Both matters were cleared by investigation/charge.

Clearance rate (100%)

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (5) harassment complaints in the month of November. (3) were cleared through investigation/charge, and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (80%)

A total of (2) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of November. The Service cleared both through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (8) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures or discretion used in the month of November

VCARS Referrals:

There were (7) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of November.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of November, Midland officers conducted a total of (57) hours of RIDE. A total of (1112) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (2) traffic cautions were issued. A total of (5) provincial offence charges were laid. One arrest for impaired driving was made during RIDE. (2) criminal charges were laid as a result of the arrest.

In addition, a total of (76) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

There were (10) driving impaired driving related charge laid this month resulting from (6) arrest.

There were (6) drug charges laid this month resulting from (6) arrests
