Dear Mr. McKenzie:

It is my pleasure, on behalf of the Midland Police Service, to present to you in your capacity as Chair of the Midland Police Services Board, our Annual Report for 2005.

The Midland Police Service continues to strive to meet the needs of the citizens that we serve by responding to calls for service in a diligent and caring manner. While incidents generated in response to community needs increased by over 700 as compared to 2004, the actual number of criminal offences reported to police were down slightly.

Property related crime, with the exception of break and enters, has generally decreased in 2005, as compared to 2004; however, robberies were up slightly over the same period. Although the number of people charged and the number of charges laid has decreased over 2004, the increasing complexity of investigative process and the disclosure requirements for successful prosecution of criminal offences, continues to tax the compliment of our Service.

In the year 2005, the Service continued to develop our technical support capabilities through the purchase of video surveillance and electronic tracking equipment. These equipment purchases, supported by the proficient skills of our technical investigator and our Information and Technology Manager, continue to augment our investigative capabilities.

In the fall of 2005, we began construction on a combination Police Garage and Records Storage facility, and we look forward to the completion of that facility in 2006.

In June of 2005, my term as President of the Ontario Association of Chiefs of Police came to an end and I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Board for both their support and encouragement in my pursuit of this very important work.






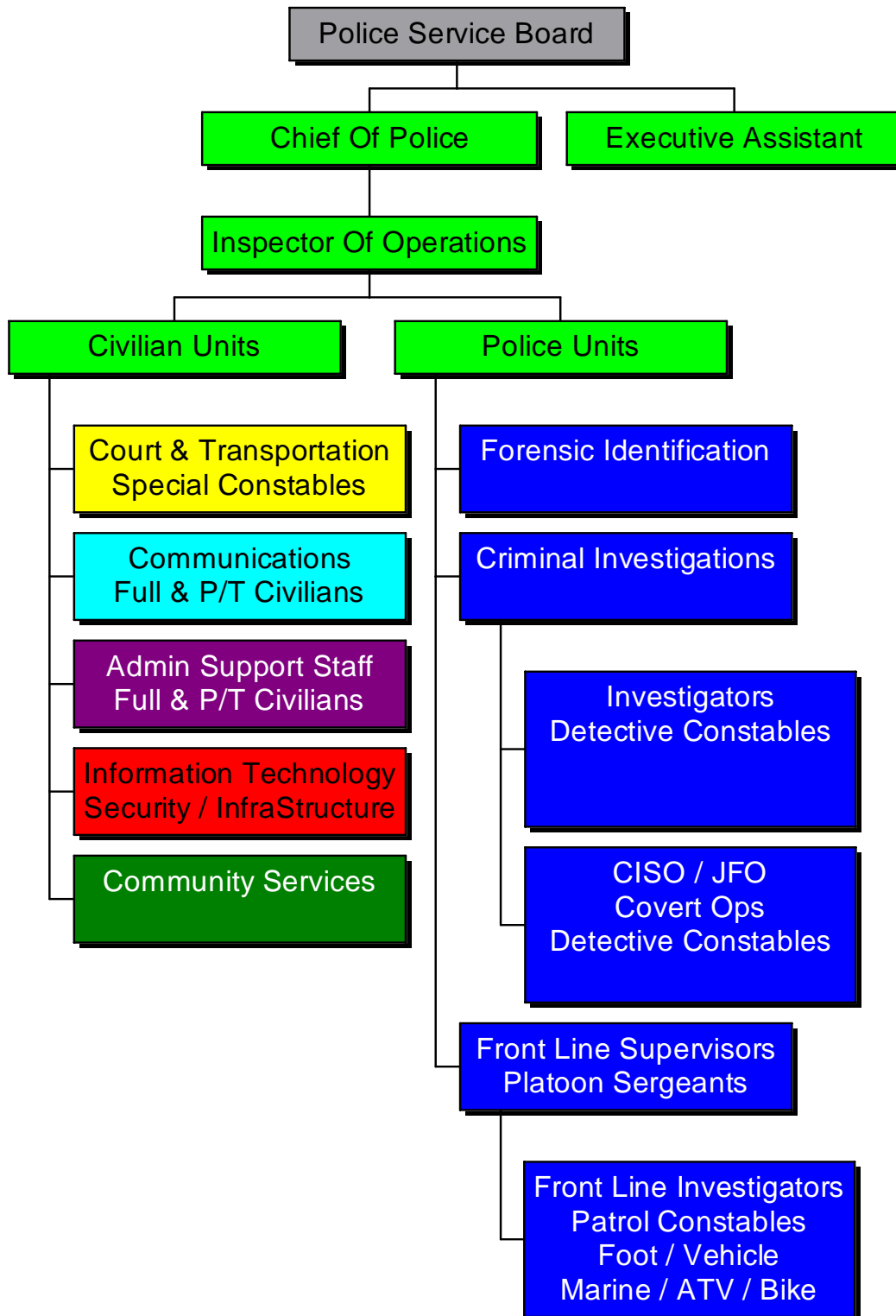
