Dear Mr. McKenzie:

As Chief of Police, it is my pleasure to present to you, in your capacity as Chair of the Police Services Board, our Midland Police Service Annual Report for 2006.

The year 2006, saw the Service generate over 9,000 incidents, which was an increase of just over 400 from the previous year. While the total number of criminal offences dropped slightly, we saw some offences such as assaults, willful damage, frauds and break and enters increase somewhat over 2005, and conversely, other offences such as thefts, robberies and sexual assaults decreased slightly from 2005. Although the total number of criminal offences reported remained consistent with 2005, and the clearance rate remained at 40%, the total number of criminal charges laid in relation to those reported offences increased by over 200 for the year.

One investigation of note was a joint investigation with the Criminal Investigation Branch of the Ontario Provincial Police that began in 2005, when the body of a 23-year-old woman was discovered in the remains of a burnt residence in Midland. This investigation resulted in Second Degree Murder charges being laid in relation to that incident in the spring of 2006, as that investigation moved forward.

During the year, we continued to enhance our equipment with the introduction of Conductive Energy Devices (Tasers) to our uniform equipment. The addition of this piece of equipment provided our officers with an additional option to ensure that the least amount of force is used when our duties require us to take control, restrain, detain or arrest a person.

Improvements to our Police Facility also continued during the year with the completion of our combination Police Garage and Records Storage Facility, which we began in the fall of 2005, and the start of interior renovations to the Police Station, which began in the fall of 2006.




In closing, I would like to acknowledge the continued dedication of all the members of the Service, who continue to serve the Board and the citizens of our community in a professional, consistent, and caring manner, as they help ensure Midland is a safe and healthy community.

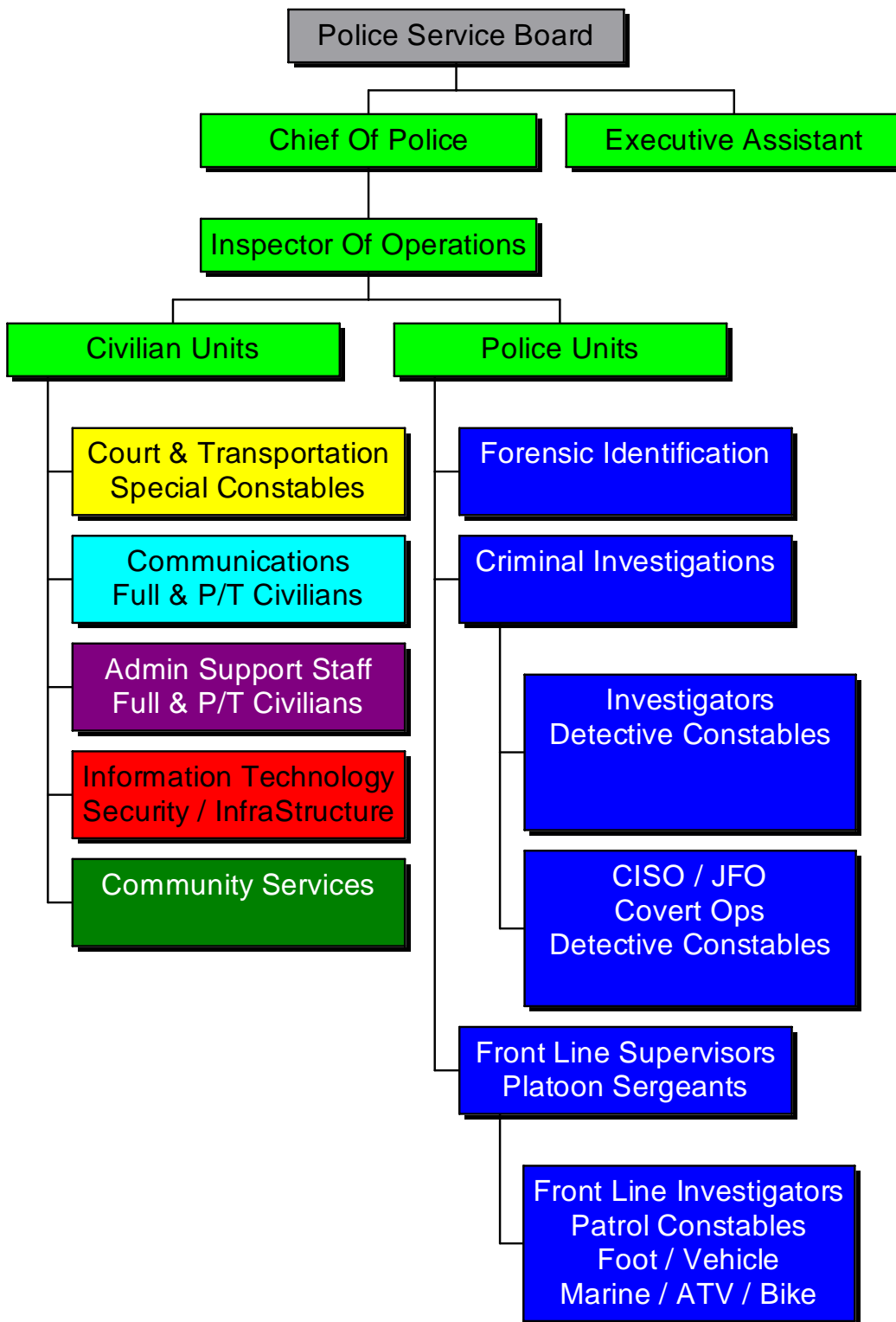

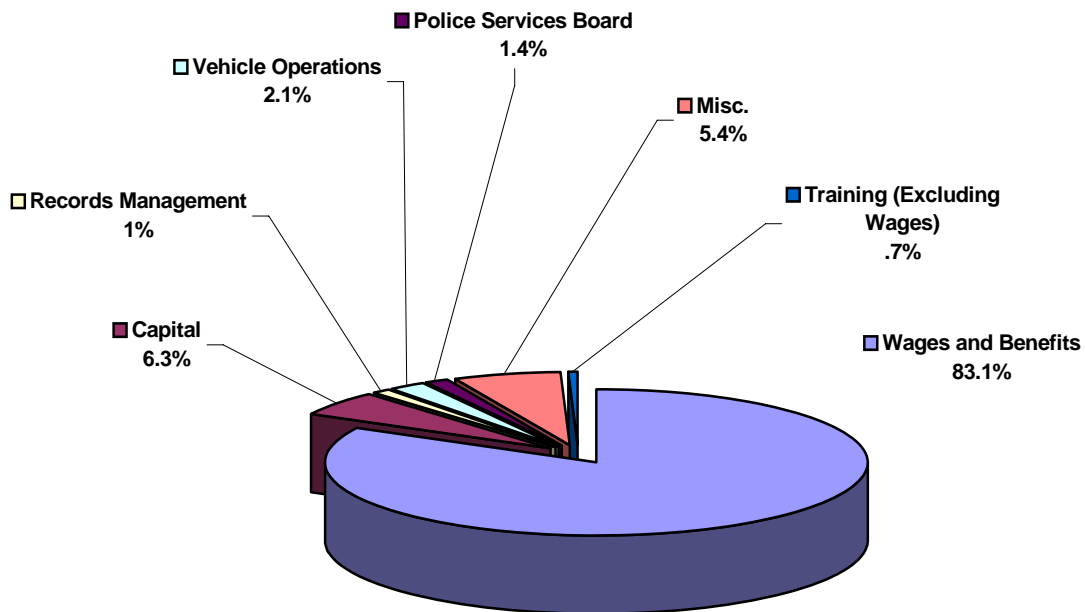

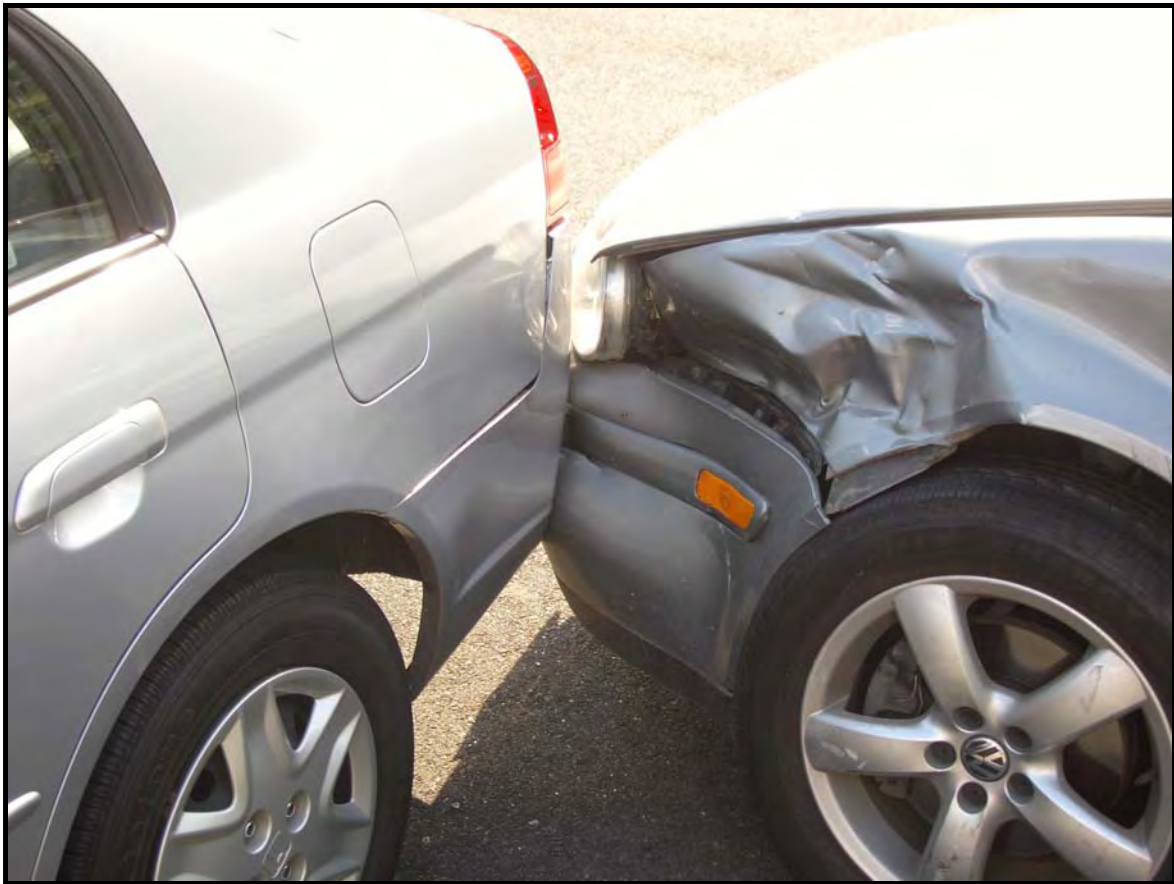
