



## MIDLAND POLICE SERVICE CHIEF'S April 2016 REPORT TO THE BOARD

Presented May 16th, 2016

During the month of April 2016, the Midland Police generated 731 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 612 incidents during the same time period in 2015. Incident reports generated to date for 2016 stand at 2659 as compared to 2300 for 2015 . (+359)

Calls for service **DO NOT** include:

- Traffic Stops, *Highway Traffic Act* charges or warnings issued
- RIDE Spot-check hours or vehicles stopped in RIDE
- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures
- Foot Patrol in high visibility areas
- Pedestrian interactions
- Parking tickets issued
- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

**CRIMINAL OFFENCES:**

**Theft Under \$5000**

There were (22) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in April 2016, compared to (17) during the same time frame in 2015. Of the (22) thefts reported, (7) were cleared through investigation or charge and (4) were cleared by diversion/discretion.

The clearance rate is (50%) for this time period.

**Mischief**

There were (18) mischiefs reported to the Service in April. By comparison (11) were reported during the same time period last year. Of the (18) reported mischiefs, (11) were cleared through investigation or charge and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance remain under investigation.

(11) of the charges laid were related to one set of suspects for graffiti related offences.

The clearance rate for this time period is (66%)

**Break and Enter**

A total of (4) break and enters were reported to the Service in April. During the same time period in 2015 there were a total of (4) reported. Of the break and enters reported for this time period, (1) was cleared by investigation/charge and the balance are under investigation by the Service.

Clearance rate is (25%)

**Fraud**

A total of (4) frauds were reported to the Service in April. (1) was cleared by investigation/charge and the balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate is (25%)

**Assault**

There where (6) assaults reported to the Service in April, compared to (2) for the same time period in 2015. Of the (6) assault calls that were reported, (4) were cleared by investigation/charge and (1) was cleared by discretion or diversion.

The clearance rate is (83%).

### **Assault with a Weapon**

There was (1) assault with a weapon reported to the Service in April. It was cleared through investigation or charge.

### **Criminal Harassment/Threats**

A total of (8) harassment cases was reported to the Midland Police Service in April. Of the (8) reported cases, (1) was cleared by investigation/charge and (6) were cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate is (87%)

A total of (4) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service in April. The Service cleared (1) of the cases by investigation/charge and (1) by diversion/discretion.

This represents a (50%) clearance rate.

### **Impaired Charges**

A total of (6) drinking and driving related charges were laid in April with three persons being arrested and charged with Impaired Driving and Drive Over 80mgs.

### **Drug Charges**

A total of (3) drug related charges were laid during the month of April 2016 with two people charged for those offences.

### **Auxiliary Hours**

A total of (150) hours were worked by Auxiliary Officers in the month of April.

### **VCARS Referrals**

A total of (4) VCARS referrals were made during the month of April 2016

### **Discretion/Diversion/Alternative Measures**

A total of (13) matters were dealt with by way of Discretion/Diversion or Alternative measures during the month of April.

**RIDE/Foot Patrol:**

During the month of April 2016, Midland officers conducted a total of (50) hours of RIDE. A total of (2233) vehicles were stopped on spot-check. (1) charge was laid under the *Provincial Offences Act*. (19) cautions were issued under the *Provincial Offences Act*; no impaired drivers were detected on spot-check locations during this time period.

A total of (83) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, North Simcoe Sports and Recreation Centre, and others.
