CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (30) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of December. Of the (30) thefts reported, (3) were cleared through investigation or charge, and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

(8) of the thefts reported to the Service were of Holiday lights and decorations. (5) of them were thefts reported from un-locked motor vehicles

Theft Over \$5,000

There was (1) theft in this category reported this month. This report was cleared by investigation/charge.

Mischief

There were (8) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion and the balance are under investigation.

Break and Enter

A total of (4) break and enters were reported to the Service in December. These matters are under investigation by the Service.

Fraud

A total of (3) frauds were reported to the Service in December. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge.

Robbery

There was (1) Robbery reported to the Service this month. It was cleared by investigation/charge.

Assault

There were (8) assaults reported to the Service in the month of December. (8) were cleared through investigation or charge.

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (4) harassment complaints in the month of December. (4) were cleared through discretion/diversion.

A total of (2) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of December. The Service cleared (1) through investigation or charge and the other matter is under investigation.

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (8) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of December 2015

VCARS Referrals:

There were (8) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of December 2015.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of December 2015, Midland officers conducted a total of (41) hours of RIDE. A total of (1128) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (4) traffic cautions were issued. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (82) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

Impaired Driving

There were (2) drinking/driving related charges laid this month as a result of (1) arrest.

Drug Charges

There were (11) drug charges laid this month by our investigators. (3) people were charged.
