CHIEF'S February 2016
REPORT TO THE BOARD
 Presented March 21st, 2016

During the month of February 2016, the Midland Police generated 564 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 550 incidents during the same time period in 2015. Incident reports generated to date for 2016 stand at 1210 as compared to 1152 for 2015.

Calls for Service **DO NOT** include:

- Traffic Stops, *Highway Traffic Act* charges or warnings issued
- RIDE Spot-check hours or vehicles stopped in RIDE
- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures
- Foot Patrol in high visibility areas
- Pedestrian interactions
- Parking tickets issued
- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (21) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of February. Of the (21) thefts reported, (6) were cleared through investigation or charge, and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance is under investigation.

Clearance rate (33%)

Mischief

There were (7) mischief occurrences reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance is under investigation.

Clearance rate (28%)

Break and Enter

A total of (3) break and enters were reported to the Service in February. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge. The remaining matters are under investigation by the Service.

Clearance rate (33%)

Fraud

(1) fraud was reported to the Service in February. It was cleared by investigation or charge.

Assault

There were (7) assaults reported to the Service in the month of February. (3) were cleared through investigation or charge and (3) were cleared by discretion /diversion. The remaining one is under investigation.

Clearance rate (85%)

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (7) harassment complaints in the month of February. (1) was cleared through investigation or charge and (6) were cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

A total of (7) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of February. The Service cleared (2) through investigation or charge and (3) were cleared by discretion/diversion. The remaining matters are under investigation.

Clearance rate (71%)

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (15) criminal matters discretion/diverted/alternative measures in the month of February 2016.

VCARS Referrals:

There were (2) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of February 2016.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of February 2016, Midland officers conducted a total of (37) hours of RIDE. A total of (784) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (3) traffic cautions were issued and (4) charges under the provincial offences act. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (73) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.
