

CRIMINAL OFFENCES:

Theft Under \$5000

There were (13) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of January, compared to (45) during the same time frame in 2014. Of the (13) thefts reported, (3) were cleared through investigation or charges and the balance are under investigation.

There is a (72%) reduction in thefts from the same time period in 2014.
The clearance rate is (23%).

The clearance rate is (33%) for this time period.

Mischief

There were (5) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. Of the (5) reported mischiefs, (1) was cleared through investigation or charge, (1) was cleared through discretion/diversion and the balance remain under investigation.

A total of (4) break and enters were reported to the Service in January. Of the break and enters reported for this time period, (1) was cleared by investigation or charge and the rest are under investigation.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of January 2015, Midland officers conducted a total of (40) hours of RIDE. A total of (863) vehicles were stopped on spot-check. (1) charge was laid under the Provincial Offences Act and (5) cautions were issued under the Provincial Offences Act.

A total of (109) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, North Simcoe Sports and Recreation Centre, and others. A total of (65) hours of foot patrol was conducted in the downtown core.

INCIDENTS OF INTEREST:

(Summary of incidents January 2015)

Impaired Operation, Over 80 mgs

On the 1st day of January, 2015, at approximately 8:05 am, Midland Police located a vehicle stuck in a large bank of snow on Hugel Avenue in the Town of Midland. The vehicle was unoccupied. Officers observed a male walking in close proximity to the

vehicle and commenced an investigation. Upon speaking to the male a strong odour of alcohol was detected and the male showed signs of impairment. The officers formed grounds to believe that male had been operating the motor vehicle and arrested him for impaired driving. The male was taken into custody and transported to the Midland Police Service for breath tests. The vehicle was seized and impounded for 7 days, his drivers licence was suspended for 90 days. The male was held in custody and sent for a bail hearing the following day.

Traffic Stop Leads to Charges

On the 17th of January 2015, at approximately 1:03 am, Midland Police Service conducted a traffic stop on a motor vehicle for a *Highway Traffic Act* violation. The investigation revealed the male driver falsely identified himself to police. Further investigation revealed the male was wanted on outstanding warrants from two other police services and was a suspended driver under the *Highway Traffic Act*. Subsequently, the male was arrested and transported to the Midland Police Service. The male has been charged accordingly and has a March 5th, 2015 court date.

The male has been remanded into custody by the other police service and will be held pending a Bail Hearing on the January 17th, 2015.
