CHIEF'S January 2017

REPORT TO THE BOARD

Presented February 21st, 2017

During the month of January 2017, the Midland Police generated 563 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 648 incidents during the same time period in 2016. Incident reports generated to date for 2017 stand at 563 as compared to 648 for 2016.

Calls for Service **DO NOT** include:

- Traffic Stops, *Highway Traffic Act* charges or warnings issued
- RIDE Spot-check hours or vehicles stopped in RIDE
- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures
- Foot Patrol in high visibility areas
- Pedestrian interactions
- Parking tickets issued
- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (13) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of January. Of the (13) thefts reported, (5) were cleared through investigation or charge, and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate (46%)

Mischief

There were (6) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (2) were cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

Break and Enter

A total of (3) break and enters were reported to the Service in January. These matters are under investigation by the Service.

Fraud

A total of (4) frauds were reported to the Service in January. These matters are under investigation by the service.

Assault

There were (2) assaults reported to the Service in the month of January. Both were cleared through investigation or charge.

Clearance rate (100%)

Assault with a Weapon or CBH

There was (1) report in this category for the month of January. This investigation was cleared by investigation or charge.

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There was (1) harassment complaint in the month of January. It was cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

A total of (2) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of January. The Service cleared both by investigation or charge.

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (4) criminal matters discretion/diverted/alternative measures in the month of January.

VCARS Referrals:

There were (2) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of January.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of January, Midland officers conducted a total of (30) hours of RIDE. A total of (576) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (7) traffic cautions were issued. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (73) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

Impaired Driving

There were (6) drinking/driving related charges laid this month as a result of (3) persons being arrested.

Drug Charges

There were (12) drug charges laid this month by our investigators. (7) people were charged.
