

MIDLAND POLICE SERVICE
CHIEF'S March 2017
REPORT TO THE BOARD
Presented April 20th, 2017



During the month of March 2017, the Midland Police responded to 631 calls for service. This is down from 720 incidents during the same time period in 2016. Incident reports generated to date for 2017 stand at 1729 as compared to 1928 for 2016.

Calls for service **DO NOT** include:

- Traffic Stops, *Highway Traffic Act* charges or warnings issued
- RIDE Spot-check hours or vehicles stopped in RIDE
- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures
- Foot Patrol in high visibility areas
- Pedestrian interactions
- Parking tickets issued
- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

Theft Under \$5,000

(10) Thefts reported. (5) were cleared through investigation or charge, and the balance are under investigation.

Mischief

(8) Mischief occurrences. (2) were cleared by investigation or charge and the balance are under investigation.

Reduction of (33%) from 2016

Break and Enter

(1) break and enter was reported this month and the matter is under investigation.

Reduction of (85%) from 2016

Fraud

(4) frauds were reported to the service this month. These matters are under investigation.

Reduction of (55%) from 2016

Attempted Murder

There was one case of attempted murder reported to Midland Police Service. This case has been resolved with the arrest and charge of the suspect responsible.

Assault

There were (10) assaults reported to the Service in the month of March. (4) were cleared through investigation or charge and (5) were cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (90%)

Criminal Harassment/Threats

(3) Harassment complaints. (1) was cleared through investigation or charge and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (66%)

(3) Threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of March. The Service cleared (2) through investigation or charge and (1) cleared by discretion/diversion. The remaining matter is under investigation.

Clearance rate (75%)

Freedom of Information Requests

There were a total of (5) Freedom of Information Requests. (3) were completed, (2) are in progress.

There were (7) criminal matters referred to discretion/diversion/alternative measures.

There were (6) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

RIDE: Midland officers conducted a total of (32) hours of RIDE, stopping (1074) vehicles in the process. A total of (7) traffic cautions were issued. (7) Provincial Offence Notices issued and (1) three day suspension. No impaired drivers were detected.

Foot Patrol: (76) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

Auxiliary Hours: (64) hours of service which included; general patrol with uniformed officers and foot patrol.
