

# MIDLAND POLICE SERVICE CHIEF® May 2014 REPORT TO THE BOARD Presented June 18th, 2014

During the month of May 2014, the Midland Police generated 679 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 733 incidents during the same time period in 2013. Incident reports generated to date for 2014 stand at 3169 as compared to 2943 for 2013.

# **CRIMINAL OFFENCES**

### Theft Under \$5,000

There were (16) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of May, compared to (18) during the same month last year. Of the (16) thefts reported, (4) were cleared through investigation or charges and (2) were cleared by discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate for thefts this month is (50%).

#### **Mischief**

There were (11) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. By comparison (14) were reported the same time last year. Of the (11) reported mischiefs, the Service was able to clear (2) through investigation and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate for mischief is (27%).

#### **Break and Enter**

A total of (5) break and enters were reported to the Service in May. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge. (8) break and enters were reported this time last year.

Clearance rate for May is (20%).

#### **Fraud**

A total of (6) frauds were reported to the Service in May. (2) were cleared through investigation or charge and the balance are under investigation

The clearance rate is (33%).

## <u>Assault</u>

There were (6) assaults reported to the Service in the month of May. Of the (6) assault calls that were reported, (5) were cleared through investigation or charge and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate is (100%).

#### **Sexual Assault**

There were (3) sexual assault reports made to the Service in the month of May. (2) of the incidents were cleared by investigation or charge and the other is currently under investigation. In the matter currently under investigation, the victim is undecided as to whether they wish to proceed with an investigation into the matter.

Clearance rate is (66%)

#### **Criminal Harassment/Threats**

A total of (5) harassment cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of May. The Service cleared (1) case through investigation or charge and (3) were dealt with by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate is (80%)

A total of (1) threatening cases was reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of May. The Service cleared it through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

# **Drug Offences**

A total of (5) drug related charges were laid by Midland officers in the month of May.

### **Distracted Driving**

A total of (4) charges for distracted driving were issued during the month of May.

## **RIDE/Foot Patrol**:

During the month of May 2014, Midland officers conducted a total of (56) hours of RIDE. A total of (2005) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (18) traffic cautions were issued. A total of (17) provincial offence notices were issued and no impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (123) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

# **INCIDENTS OF INTEREST**: (Summary of May incidents)

## Fraud Under \$5,000

On May 21<sup>st</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2014, a volunteer with a local national non-profit organization, stole two cheques and cashed them at a local bank. During the course of the investigation by Midland Police Service, it was determined that a warrant existed for his arrest for Failing to Comply with Probation.

The volunteer was charged, released and is scheduled to appear in the Midland Court of Justice on June 26<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

# **Assault and Forcible Confinement**

On May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2014, at 12:22 am, Midland Police Service responded to a domestic assault in progress at residence located on the west side of Town. The victim was assaulted, bitten, head butted, strangled and forced into a closet along with a child. At one point during this incident, the victim was holding the child and the child was hit.

The suspect was intoxicated and on probation not to consume alcohol. The suspect was charged and held for a bail hearing on May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2014, in the Barrie Court of Justice.
