



**MIDLAND POLICE SERVICE**  
**CHIEF'S May 2016**  
**REPORT TO THE BOARD**  
 Presented June 20th, 2016

During the month of May 2016, the Midland Police generated 759 incident reports in response to community needs. This is up from 727 incidents during the same time period in 2015. Incident reports generated to date for 2016 stand at 3418 as compared to 3027 for 2015.

### **CRIMINAL OFFENCES**

#### **Theft Under \$5,000**

There were (21) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of May, compared to (31) during the same month last year. Of the (21) thefts reported, (4) were cleared through investigation or charges; the balance are under investigation.

The clearance rate for thefts this month is (19%).

### **Theft Over \$5,000**

There was (1) theft over \$5,000 dollars during the month of May. This matter is currently under investigation and involved the theft of two personal water craft.

### **Mischief**

There were (8) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. By comparison (10) were reported the same time last year. Of the (8) reported mischiefs, the Service was able to clear (1) through investigation. The balance are under investigation.

The clearance rate for mischief is (12%).

### **Break and Enter**

A total of (3) break and enters were reported to the Service in May. These matters are under investigation. (2) break and enters were reported this time last year.

### **Fraud**

A total of (8) frauds were reported to the Service in May. (3) were cleared through investigation or charge and the others are under investigation. There were (2) frauds reported at this time last year.

The clearance rate is (37%).

### **Assault**

There were (8) assaults reported to the Service in the month of May. Of the (8) assault calls that were reported, (6) were cleared through investigation or charge and (2) by discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate is (100%).

### **Sexual Assault**

There were (2) sexual assault reports made to the Service in the month of May. Both of the incidents were cleared by investigation or charge.

Clearance rate is (100%)

### **Criminal Harassment/Threats**

A total of (5) harassment cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of May. The Service cleared (1) by investigation/charge and (3) by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate is (80%)

A total of (3) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of May. The Service cleared (1) by investigation or charge and the other by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (66%)

**Drug Offences**

A total of (6) drug related charges were laid by Midland officers in the month of May, with (5) persons being processed for those charges.

**Impaired Driving**

(2) charges for drinking and driving were laid during the month of May as a result of one arrest.

**Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:**

There were (7) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of May 2016

**VCARS referrals:**

There were (5) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of May 2016.

**RIDE/Foot Patrol:**

During the month of May 2016, Midland officers conducted a total of (52) hours of RIDE. A total of (2056) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (26) traffic cautions were issued. A total of (4) provincial offence notices were issued and no impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (85) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.
