

MIDLAND POLICE SERVICE
CHIEF'S May 2017
REPORT TO THE BOARD
Presented June 19th, 2017



During the month of May 2017, the Midland Police generated 671 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 759 incidents during the same time period in 2016. Incident reports generated to date for 2017 stand at 3009 as compared to 3418 for 2016.

Calls for service **DO NOT** include:

- Traffic Stops, *Highway Traffic Act* charges or warnings issued
- RIDE Spot-check hours or vehicles stopped in RIDE
- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures
- Foot Patrol in high visibility areas
- Pedestrian interactions
- Parking tickets issued
- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (19) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of May, compared to (21) during the same month last year. Of the (19) thefts reported, (3) were cleared through investigation or charges, (1) was cleared through discretion/diversion; the balance are under investigation.

The clearance rate for thefts this month is (21%).

Mischief

There were (6) mischiefs reported to the service this month. By comparison (8) were reported the same time last year. These matters are under investigation.

There is a (25%) reduction in thefts over this month last year.

Break and Enter

There were (3) break and enters reported to the service this month. One of those were cleared by investigation or charge.

Clearance rate is (33%)

Fraud

A total of (6) frauds were reported to the service in May. (2) were cleared through investigation or charge and the others are under investigation.

The clearance rate is (33%).

Assault

There were (4) assaults reported to the service in the month of May. Of the (4) assault calls that were reported, (2) were cleared through investigation or charge and (1) by discretion/diversion. The remaining matter is under investigation.

The clearance rate is (75%).

Criminal Harassment/Threats

A total of (3) harassment cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of May. The Service cleared (2) by discretion/diversion. The remaining matter is under investigation.

Clearance rate is (66%)

A total of (3) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of May. The Service cleared (2) by investigation or charge and the other by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

Impaired Driving

(2) charges for drinking and driving were laid during the month of May as a result of two arrests.

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (5) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of May

VCARS referrals:

There were (10) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of May.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of May, Midland officers conducted a total of (40) hours of RIDE. A total of (2161) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (9) traffic cautions were issued. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (66) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.


