During the month of November 2015, the Midland Police generated 667 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 684 incidents during the same time period in 2014. Incident reports generated to date for 2015 stand at 7358 as compared to 7629 for 2014.

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (19) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of November. Of the (19) thefts reported, (2) were cleared through investigation or charge, and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation. (34) thefts were reported to the Service this time last year.

There is a (55%) reduction in thefts from November of 2014

Mischief

There were (11) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by investigation/charge and the balance are under investigation.

Break and Enter

A total of (12) break and enters were reported to the Service in November. These matters are under investigation by the Service.

Fraud

A total of (2) frauds were reported to the Service in November. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge.

Assault

There were (9) assaults reported to the Service in the month of November. (5) were cleared through investigation or charge and (3) were cleared through discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate is (88%).

Assaults are down (25%) over this time last year.

Sexual Assault

There was (1) sexual assault reported this month. This matter was cleared by investigation/charge.

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (5) harassment complaints in the month of November. (3) were cleared through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (60%)

A total of (2) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of November. The Service cleared both through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (9) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of November 2015

VCARS Referrals:

There were (15) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of November 2015.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of November 2015, Midland officers conducted a total of (66) hours of RIDE. A total of (2482) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (6) traffic cautions were issued. A total of (3) provincial offence charges were laid. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (117) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

Impaired Driving

There was (1) driving while over 80 mgs charge laid this month resulting from (1) arrest.

Drug Charges

There were (5) drug charges laid this month resulting from (4) arrests
