During the month of October 2015, the Midland Police generated 630 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 759 incidents during the same time period in 2014. Incident reports generated to date for 2015 stand at 6642 as compared to 6945 for 2014.

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (34) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of October. Of the (34) thefts reported, (1) was cleared through discretion/diversion and the balance are under investigation.

(14) of these thefts were from unlocked vehicles and (2) were as a result of property being left insecure. Therefore (47%) of these thefts were preventable

Mischief

There were (8) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (1) of these were cleared by discretion/diversion and the balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate is (12%).

Break and Enter

A total of (7) break and enters were reported to the Service in October. (2) were cleared by investigation or charge and the balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate is (28%)

Fraud

A total of (3) frauds were reported to the Service in October. (2) were cleared by investigation or charge, (1) is under investigation.

Clearance rate (66%)

Assault

There were (9) assaults reported to the Service in the month of October. (5) were cleared through investigation or charge and (2) was cleared through discretion/diversion.

The clearance rate is (77%).

Assault with a Weapon

There was (1) assault with a weapon reported to the Service this month. This matter was cleared by investigation/charge.

Sexual Assault

There was (1) sexual assault reported this month. This matter is under investigation and does not pose a threat to the citizens of Midland.

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There was (1) harassment complaints in the month of October. It was cleared though discretion/diversion.

A total of (4) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of October. The Service cleared (2) through investigation/charge and (2) were cleared through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (6) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of October 2015

VCARS Referrals:

There were (6) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of October 2015.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of October 2015, Midland officers conducted a total of (63) hours of RIDE. A total of (2613) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (38) traffic cautions were issued. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (84) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

There were (4) impaired driving charges laid this month resulting from (2) arrests
