CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (21) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of January. Of the (21) thefts reported, (6) were cleared through investigation or charge, and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate (33%)

Mischief

There were (5) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge and (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

Break and Enter

A total of (5) break and enters were reported to the Service in January. These matters are under investigation by the Service.

Fraud

A total of (2) frauds were reported to the Service in January. (1) was cleared by discretion/diversion and the other is under investigation.

Robbery

There was (1) robbery reported to the Service this month. It was cleared by investigation/charge.

Assault

There were (10) assaults reported to the Service in the month of January. (6) were cleared through investigation or charge and three were cleared by discretion /diversion. The remaining one is under investigation.

Clearance rate (90%)

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (7) harassment complaints in the month of January. (1) was cleared through investigation or charge and (6) were cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

A total of (2) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of January. The Service cleared (1) through discretion/diversion and the other matter is under investigation.

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (13) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of January 2016.

VCARS Referrals:

There were (8) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of January 2016.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of January 2016, Midland officers conducted a total of (57) hours of RIDE. A total of (1204) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (18) traffic cautions were issued. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (111) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

Impaired Driving

There were (5) drinking/driving related charges laid this month as a result of (3) persons being arrested.

Drug Charges

There were (10) drug charges laid this month by our investigators. (3) people were charged.
