7. BUSINESS ARISING:

Chief Osborne stated a review of inventory is in progress. He advised the Board that they need to work with Town to determine assets with the OPP specifically with regards to prohibited weapons and radios.

8. CORRESPONDENCE:

Correspondence from Midland Police Association regarding Retention of Records

MPA President Adam Hawes and Vice President Bill Gordon attended to discuss their recent correspondence to the Board. They repeated their position and asked that the Board stick by their previous retention period and destroy their records they feel should have been previously destroyed under their previous retention bylaw.

J. Contin brought forth a motion to destroy the records prior to the date of the new bylaw.

SECONDED BY: J. Attwood.

The Board had a discussion about same and advised their position on wanting to keep the records for possible future OCPC hearings. MPA President Hawes stated that if the Board kept to their own procedure this conversation would not be happening.

9. CHIEF'S DEPARTMENT REPORT:

S. Strathearn asked about the increased number of assaults. Inspector Wheeldon explained they are individualized in nature, and a random phenomenon.

Chair Dixon asked about MPS and OPP assistance and why it is no longer included in the report. Chief Osborne stated it became a moot point when OPP said they were providing thousands of hours without any report so it does not seem accurate to track.

Chair Dixon asked about downtown activities by St. Paul's church. Inspector Wheeldon stated there are continuous issues because of the establishment but when they officers arrive certain thresholds need to be met to lay a charge.

Member Contin wanted to know if there will be a change in RIDE hours once the Midland Police disband and Inspector Wheeldon stated that would be a question for the OPP.

11. MIDLAND POLICE ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE ADDRESS THE BOARD.

MPA President Hawes discussed a letter from their counsel regarding the outstanding Police Service Act matter. He wanted to know when a response can be expected and advised that they wish to have discussions in a timely manner. The Board advised they just received the letter and had not yet began a discussion about same.

Adam Hawes then discussed contract negotiations. He provided a Notice of Intent to Bargain for 2018. He stated the MPA is prepared to meet to discuss any articles referring specifically to disbandment and salary negotiations.

Chair Dixon said he will try to schedule an exchange of proposals.

12. NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion regarding Towing Tender

Chief Osborne asked the Board if they want to go to a new tender or extend the current one. Chair Dixon stated while the 12th of February is the target date it is possible that it could be extended to June. He also stated for such a short period like this he believes it does not make sense to go out to tender.

It was agreed to defer this discussion to the next meeting.

Chief Osborne stated that he is not renewing any agreements we do not need to do. We have filtering and data threat prevention subscriptions that need to be renewed and the total cost is about \$5000.00. It is within budget but it will take us towards the end of next year and it is required.

The Board unanimously agreed to approve the amount of \$5537.00 to protect data and software.

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (32) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of October. Of the (32) thefts reported, (6) were cleared through investigation/charge and (2) were cleared through discretion/diversion. The balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate (25%)

Mischief

There were (5) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by discretion or diversion and the balance are under investigation.

Clearance rate is (20%).

Break and Enter

There were (2) break and enters this month; both are under investigation.

Fraud

There were (8) frauds reported this month. (1) was cleared by investigation/charge and the other was cleared by discretion/diversion.

Most fraud types are fraudulent phone calls where the consumer is baited into parting with their money

Clearance rate (25%)

Assault

There were (2) assaults reported to the Service in the month of October. Both were cleared by investigation/charge.

The clearance rate is (100%).

Sexual Assault

There was (1) sexual assault reported this month. The matter was resolved by investigation/charge.

Clearance rate (100%)

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (4) harassment complaints in the month of October. (2) were cleared through investigation/charge and (1) were cleared by discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (75%)

A total of (3) threatening cases were reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of October. The Service cleared (2) through investigation/charge and (1) was cleared through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (7) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of October

VCARS Referrals:

There were (2) referrals to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of October

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of October, Midland officers conducted a total of (23) hours of RIDE. A total of (693) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. A total of (10) traffic cautions were issued. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (48) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.
