CHIEF'S September 2017 REPORT TO THE BOARD

Presented October 16th, 2017

Calls for Service **DO NOT** include:

- Traffic Stops, *Highway Traffic Act* charges or warnings issued
- RIDE Spot-check hours or vehicles stopped in RIDE
- Community Service events, meetings, school visits, drop in visits, or lectures
- Foot Patrol in high visibility areas
- Pedestrian interactions
- Parking tickets issued
- **Some** miscellaneous provincial statute charges

During the month of September 2017, the Midland Police generated 741 incident reports in response to community needs. This is down from 754 incidents during the same time period in 2016. Incident reports generated to date for 2017 stand at 6240 as compared to 6617 for 2016.

CRIMINAL OFFENCES

Theft Under \$5,000

There were (22) thefts reported to the Midland Police Service in the month of September. Of the (22) thefts reported, (4) were cleared through investigation or charges. The balance are under investigation.

The clearance rate for thefts this month is (18%).

Mischief

There were (9) mischiefs reported to the Service this month. (1) was cleared by investigation or charge. The balance are currently under investigation.

Clearance rate (11%).

Break and Enter

A total of (3) break and enters were reported to the Service in September. All (3) are under investigation.

Fraud

A total of (7) frauds were reported to the Service in September. (2) were cleared by investigation or charges.

Clearance rate (28%)

Assault

There were (9) assaults reported to the Service in the month of September. (7) were cleared through investigation or charge, one was cleared by discretion/diversion and the other is under investigation.

Clearance rate (88%).

Robbery

There was (1) robbery reported to the Service this month. This matter is under investigation.

Criminal Harassment/Threats

There were (3) harassment complaints in the month of September. (3) were cleared through investigation or charges.

Clearance rate (100%)

A total of (1) threatening case was reported to the Midland Police Service during the month of September. The Service cleared (1) through discretion/diversion.

Clearance rate (100%)

Discretion/Diversions/Alternative Measures – YCJA/Other:

There were (2) criminal matters diverted/alternative measures in the month of September.

VCARS Referrals:

There was (1) referral to the Victim Crisis and Referral Service in the month of September.

RIDE/Foot Patrol:

During the month of September, Midland officers conducted a total of (17.5) hours of RIDE. A total of (695) vehicles were stopped by Midland officers this month. No impaired drivers were detected by officers.

In addition, a total of (39) hours of foot patrol was conducted in our high visibility locations, including the downtown area, Rotary Trail, NSSRC and others.

Drug Charges

There were (4) drug charges laid this month and (3) people arrested for those charges.

COMMUNITY SERVICE:

This month the CSO participated in the second annual Toy Day in support of the Salvation Army; he also assisted with the Terry Fox Run.

The CSO participated in (1) FACE referral for a drug related matter.

The service also participated in the North Simcoe Situation Table.
